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## ROBERT DE BALKANY ROME AND THE COTE D'AZUR

**London –** We are pleased to present the upcoming auction *Robert de Balkany: Rome and the Côte d'Azur* which will take place at Christie's King Street on <u>22</u> and <u>23</u> March 2017. Comprising over 700 works of art from two of the celebrated businessman's residences, palazzo Lancellotti in Rome, the interiors of which were designed by Federico Forquet and château Balsan in Eze, which was decorated by Jacques Garcia. The sales will be a testament to Robert de Balkany's discerning eye and vision as a collector and connoisseur.

Robert de Balkany was an energetic and passionate collector of European and English fine and decorative arts, particularly clocks, silver, furniture and Old Masters; he amassed exquisite works of art with a discerning and particular eye to create sumptuous interiors. The collection unites works he inherited from his father, Aladar Zelinger de Balkany with pieces he acquired over a period of more than 50 years.

The collection reflects de Balkany's passion for a range of periods and styles - from the Renaissance and the Baroque to the Neoclassical, Empire and Regency periods – as well as precious materials including hardstones, marble, bronze and Boulle marquetry. De Balkany decorated his houses with richly-worked textiles and materials of the highest quality, which he combined with works of art to great effect, creating an atmosphere of both luxury and comfort. A generous and charming host, his exquisite homes were the setting for entertaining glamourous friends from the worlds of business, polo, yachting and European royalty. Royalty who frequented Eze and de Balkany's yacht included HSH Prince Rainier III and Princess Grace of Monaco, HM King Leopold III and Princess Lilian of Belgium, and HM Constantine II and HM Anne- Marie of Greece; guests hosted by de Balkany also included Marella Agnelli (Princess Marella Caracciolo di Castagneto), Stavros Spyros Niarchos and Eugenia Livanos, and Patricia Kennedy Lawford, as well as the famed English actors and writers David Niven,

A highlight of the auction is the magnificent Duke of York silver-gilt centrepiece by Edward Farrell, depicting Hercules slaying the Hydra (*illustrated above right*, estimate: £400,000–600,000). Another two works by the silversmith Edward Farrell feature in the collection, lots 198 and 199.

Further highlights of the auction are six paintings depicting scenes from the life of Alexander the Great, by Gaspare Diziani (in part illustrated right, estimate: £120,000–180,000; and an important selection of over 60 clocks including a

Ver 60 clocks including a Louis XIV mantel clock with figures of Le Jour et La Nuit after Michelangelo (illustrated left, estimate: £80,000–120,000.)





The collector's discerning eye and extravagant spirit is also encapsulated by the a pair of large Swedish Blyberg porphyry urns on pedestals from the early 19<sup>th</sup> century (*illustrated above left*, estimate: £30,000-50,000); a pair of French gilt and patinated-bronze busts of Louis II De Bourbon, Prince De Conde (1621-1685) and Henri De La Tour D'Auvergne, Vicomte De Turenne (1611-1675), which were cast in the first half of 19<sup>th</sup> Century (*illustrated above centre*, estimate: £60,000-100,000); and a Russian ormolu-mounted malachite Tazza *circa* 1830-40 (*illustrated above right*, estimate: £50,000-80,000). These bold works showcase the level of outstanding craftsmanship in De Balkany's impressive collection, an opportunity not to miss for distinguished collectors in search of historical treasures.
