The Ultimate Private Collection Featuring The Greatest Burgundies 20 May

The Ultimate Private Collection Featuring The Greatest Burgundies sales totalled HK\$45,607,125 / US\$5,900,032 and was 98% sold by lot and value. The top lot of the sale was 3 MAGNUMS OF DOMAINE DE LA ROMANÉE-CONTI, ROMANÉE-CONTI 2004, which realised HK\$1,000,000 / US\$129,359.



Handbags & Accessories 21 May

Handbags & Accessories achieved a historic record-breaking result at HK\$55,172,500 / US\$7,137,471, the highest ever sale total for the category for any auction house worldwide, and was 94% sold by lot and 96% sold by value.

The top lot of the sale was: A RARE, MATTE WHITE HIMALAYA NILOTICUS CROCODILE RETOURNÉ KELLY 28 WITH PALLADIUM HARDWARE, HERMÈS, 2020, which sold for HK\$2,750,000 / US\$355,758.

An Exceptional Season of Watches & The Legends of Time 22 May

Watches Department achieved the highest ever total for a various-owner sale for the category at Christie's, realising **HK\$269,277,500 / US\$34,850,855 / EUR 28,440,551**, with a combined sell-through rate of **85%**, **139%** hammer above low estimate, **43%** of lots surpassed pre-sale high estimates, and set **10** world auction records for references across both sales.



An Exceptional Season of Watches totalled HK\$124,842,500 / US\$16,157,562 / EUR 13,185,615, and was 83% sold by lot and 88% sold by value, and 126% hammer above low estimate.

The top lot of the sale was an important PATEK PHILIPPE, THE ONLY KNOWN 18K GOLD SPLIT SECONDS CHRONOGRAPH WRISTWATCH RETAILED BY GÜBELIN, REF. 1436, MANUFACTURED IN 1965, which was acquired for HK\$ 5,500,000 / US\$711,830, more than double its low estimate of HK\$ 2,400,000 / US\$3 10,617, and set a new auction record for the reference.



The Legends of Time was 100% sold, and totalled HK\$144,435,000 / US\$18,693,293 / EUR15,254,936.

The top lot of the sale was a PATEK PHILIPPE. A UNIQUE, EXCEPTIONAL AND HISTORICALLY HIGHLY IMPORTANT 18K GOLD AUTOMATIC PERPETUAL CALENDAR WRISTWATCH WITH ENGLISH CALENDAR, LEAP YEAR INDICATION AND "NO MOON", REF. 3448 "ALAN BANBERY", SPECIALLY MODIFIED BY REQUEST OF HENRI AND PHILIPPE STERN IN 1975 AS A UNIQUE PIECE FOR PRESENTATION TO ALAN BANBERY, MANUFACTURED IN 1970, which realised HK\$29,050,000 / US\$3,759,755, setting a new auction record for the reference.

Hong Kong Magnificent Jewels 23 May



Hong Kong Magnificent Jewels achieved HK\$593,437,500 / US\$76,804,799, and was 82% sold by lot and 87% sold by value.

The top lot of the sale was a **15.81 CARAT FANCY VIVID PURPLE PINK INTERNALLY FLAWLESS DIAMOND** -

THE SAKURA, which realised **HK\$226,275,000 / US\$29,285,318**, to establish a world record price at auction for the largest purple pink diamond.

20th & 21st Century Art Evening Sale on 24 May 20th & 21st Century Art Morning and Afternoon Sessions on 25 May Mr Doodle: Caravan Chaos on 25 May

20th and 21st Century Art Auction Series achieved HK\$1,983,506,250 / US\$256,666,850.











The Evening Sale totalled a record-breaking HK\$1,585,290,000 / US\$205,138,773, the highest ever Evening Sale total for the category. The top lot across the sale series was Jean-Michel Basquiat's UNTITLED (ONE EYED MAN OR XEROX FACE) (Centre), which realised HK\$234,290,000 / US\$30,317,362 to become the second most valuable Western artwork to sell at auction in Asia. This follows the market-defining prices set at Christie's in Hong Kong on March 2021 and New York on May 2021.

The <u>Morning Session</u>, <u>Afternoon Session</u>, and <u>Mr Doodle: Caravan Chaos</u> together achieved HK\$398,211,250 / US\$51,528,077, a combined sell-through rate of 95% with over 60% of lots sold above high estimates and a spectacular 174% hammer above low estimate, the highest ever Day Sale total for the category in Asia.

The top lot of the Morning Session was **HORSE** by **Henry Moore**, which realised **HK\$4,750,000** / **US\$\$614,655** (below left).

The top lot of the Afternoon Session was **MULTICOLORED PORTRAIT** by **George Condo**, which realised **HK\$22,450,000 / US\$2,905,053** (upper left).

Mr Doodle: Caravan Chaos was a white-glove sale, with all works surpassing its pre-sale low estimates to total HK\$5,668,750 / US\$731,081. The top lot of the sale was Caravan Chaos: Side 3 Panel 6 which was enthusiastically sought-after by bidders to realise HK\$725,000 / US\$93,816, almost three times above its pre-sale high estimate. A Modern Masterpiece by Zhang Daqian on 24 May Fine Chinese Classical Paintings and Calligraphy on 26 May Fine Chinese Modern and Contemporary Ink Paintings on 27 May

The series of Chinese Paintings live sales realised a combined total of **HK\$449,836,250** / **US\$58,220,772**, with a sell-through rate of 81%, and 66% of lots sold above high estimates.







The leading highlight of the season is the magnificent *TEMPLE AT THE MOUNTAIN PEAK* by **Zhang Daqian** (*Right*) which sold for **HK\$209,100,000** / **US\$27,062,468**, to become the second-highest price ever achieved for the artist at auction. It is also the highest auction price realised in five years for the artist, continuing Christie's leadership in bringing the finest works by Zhang Daqian to auction.

Fine Chinese Classical Paintings and Calligraphy totalled HK\$72,872,500 / US\$9,429,147 with a sell-through rate of 72% by lot and 65% of lots sold above high estimates. The top lot of the sale was SEVEN POEMS IN RUNNING SCRIPT by Wen Zhengming, which sold for nine times its pre-sale low estimate at HK\$18,250,000 / US\$2,361,411 (Upper Right).

Fine Chinese Modern and Contemporary Ink Paintings totalled HK\$167,863,750 / US\$21,733,874, with a sell-through rate of 85% and 66% of lots sold above high estimates. The top lot of the sale was LANDSCAPE HIDDEN IN MIST AFTER BI HONG by Zhang Daqian, which achieved HK\$25,450,000 / US\$3,295,096 (Bottom Right).

Chinese Jade Carvings From a Distinguished European Classical Chinese Furniture from Heveningham Hall Important Chinese Ceramics and Works of Art - On 28 May







On 28 May 2021, Christie's held three themed live auctions for the category - Jade Carvings From A Distinguished European Collection, Classical Chinese Furniture From Heveningham Hall, and Important Chinese Ceramics and Works of Art. The combined sales realised a total of HK\$348,910,000 / US\$45,168,016.

Chinese Classical Furniture From Heveningham Hall totalled HK\$118,262,500 / US\$15,311,836, and was 73% sold by lot and 171% hammer above low estimate. Almost 60% of lots were sold above high estimate. Top lot of the sale and also of the sale series was A Magnificent and Exceedingly Rare Huanghuali Folding Horseshoe-Back Armchair, Jiaoyi, Late Ming-Early Qing Dynasty, 17th Century, which sold over 5.5 times above the high estimate for HK\$65,975,000 / US\$8,542,001 (above centre), establishing a new world auction record for a huanghuali folding armchair after 10-minutes of intense phone bidding competition.

Jade Carvings From A Distinguished European Collection totalled HK\$23,462,500 / US\$3,037,767 and was 93% sold by lot and 144% hammer above low estimate. 81% of lots were sold above high estimate. The top lot of the sale was *An Imperial Finely-Carved And Reticulated Spinach-Green Jade Brush Pot*, *Qianlong Period* (1736-1795), which fetched HK\$3,500,000 / US\$453,157 (above left).

Important Chinese Ceramics and Works of Art totalled HK\$207,185,000 / US\$26,818,412 with 53% of lots sold above the high estimate. The top lot of the sale was An Important And Extremely Rare Blue And White 'Kui Dragon' Jar, Xuande Six-Character Mark In Underglaze Blue Within A Double Circle And Of The Period (1426-1435) from the private collection of the esteemed Mr. Robert Chang, which sold for HK\$31,450,000 / US\$4,070,947 (above right). Proceeds from the sale will benefit The Robert Chang Art Education Charitable Foundation.
